

Bore Place is committed to providing buildings and facilities that are accessible to the widest possible audience. We are actively working to increase the accessibility and usability of our buildings and facilities, and in doing so adhere to many of the available standards and guidelines.

# Parking

Wide, accessible parking spaces are provided close to the entrance of the main public car park. Further parking spaces are reserved in the heart of the site, close to residential buildings, for disabled visitors.

## Public outdoor areas

The surface from the car park to Reception and the residential buildings is level and gravelled. There is a raised boardwalk to the Kitchen and Market Gardens, and accessible level paths through all gardens.

## Toilets

Wheelchair accessible toilets are located in: Reception and The Granary, and there is an outdoor accessible toilet in the Reception courtyard. For Venue guests, there are additional accessible toilets on the ground floor of The Old Stable and Bore Place House.

## Venue guests

*The Old Stable* has facilities for wheelchair users including an accessible ground-floor bedroom with access to the bed from both sides, and a wet-room style bathroom designed for ease with a roll-in shower, grab rails and emergency pull cords.

*Bore Place House* is wheelchair accessible on the ground floor, and has a wheelchair accessible toilet. We regret that there are no accessible bedrooms in this building.

*Middle Yard* is fully accessible with level entrances and 2 wheelchair accessible toilets.

The Large Barn is wheelchair accessible, with ramp entrance from the Farm Road doors.

The Small Barn is wheelchair accessible on the ground floor, with temporary ramps.

### Walking trails

The Bore Place Walks are not wheelchair accessible, covering uneven ground, with access including stiles and gates. However, there is an accessible mini trail loop which leads from the car park, over the stream to the meadow, back into the wild garden, emerging into the Green Man Glade and back to the start.
