Position summary

To manage Commonwork's Organic Dairy Farm in line with the objectives of the Farm Board

Key Tasks and responsibilities

- To oversee and support the day to day running of the farm, including managing the herd, the dairy and associated crop production, in line with organic farming standards.
- To improve farm and herd performance.
- To oversee the financial management of the farm including setting annual budgets and proactive financial management.
- To maintain and improve the conservation value of the estate including management of the Stewardship Scheme, grants and BPS.
- Maintain and build strong working relationships with landlords and tenants.
- To set and deliver annual work programmes for the farm and staff.
- Proactive staff management including annual staff reviews and training programmes.
- To provide training opportunities via student and work placements and support the Trust's education team.
- To proactively manage the Bore Place Estate including woodland (24 ha), private tenancy agreements both tenant and landlord, renewable energy installations and estate properties.
- To undertake proactive management of health and safety standards across the farm estate.
- To lead the development and delivery of further farm enterprises.
- To represent the Farm at Quarterly Trustee Meetings to report on farm work programmes and budget.
