Important information about your visit

- Please ensure pupils bring a packed lunch
- Please ensure that pupils wear suitable clothing: this should be something that won't spoil if it gets a bit dirty and should be appropriate for the season of your visit. At all times of the year, the optimum clothing includes <u>waterproofs</u> and <u>wellies</u>.
- It is essential that all pupils and participants bring two pairs of footwear: a pair suitable for the tour
 of the farm (ideally wellies) and a pair for indoor/travel use.

Summary of activities

The Three Little Pigs in the Green Man Glade

Listen to the story of the Three Little Pigs in the Green Man Glade. In groups pupils will use real straw, twigs and mini bricks to retell the story in their own words.

Rhyming Rabbit and farm tour

Listen to the story of The Rhyming Rabbit and practise Rhyming Words. Visit the farm to see our organic dairy cows (and calves in autumn), find out where they live, what they eat, how they are looked after and what they produce. In groups, pupils will think of farm Rhyming Words that they can use to create a simple poem about the cows.

Waste audit

Pupils will be encouraged and helped to sort their lunch leftovers into containers for recyclable and non-recyclable items, as well as food waste for composting.

Telling Tales in the Kitchen Garden

Using story cubes, and working in groups, pupils will create a story in the main setting of the Kitchen Garden involving 'characters', settings, plots, beginnings and endings.



Links to the New Primary Curriculum

A Telling Tales Day programme contributes to the following curriculum areas:

- learning to appreciate rhymes and poems...
- identify with and explore characters and to try out new vocabulary
- sequencing sentences to form short narratives
- becoming increasingly familiar with and retelling a wide range of stories, fairy stories and traditional tales and considering particular characteristics
- participate in discussion about books, poems and other works that are read to them...
- writing poetry
- draw on drama and role play through improvising scenes to develop and order ideas for writing.

- find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air). (Year 2)
