Important information about your visit

- Please ensure pupils bring a packed lunch
- Please ensure that pupils wear suitable clothing: this should be something that won't spoil if it gets a bit dirty and should be appropriate for the season of your visit. At all times of the year, the optimum clothing includes waterproofs and wellies.
- **It is essential that all pupils and participants bring two pairs of footwear: a pair suitable for the tour of the farm (ideally wellies) and a pair for indoor/travel use.**

Summary of activities

Tour around the grounds of Bore Place

Pupils will have the opportunity to see various examples of recycling happening around the site, including composting, bottle banks and recycling in the vegetable garden. They will also note seasonal changes in nature and collect some organic matter to use to decorate their papermaking.

Paper and notebook making

Pupils will see a paper and notebook making demonstration and hear about the history of paper making and why recycling paper is important. They will make their own paper, embellished with their own organic matter they have collected around the grounds of Bore place as well as a notebook of recycled paper.

Waste audit

Pupils will be encouraged and helped to sort their lunch leftovers into containers for recyclable and non-recyclable items, as well as food waste for composting.

Tour of farm

Pupils will visit the farm to see our organic dairy cows and their calves. They will also learn how the cows are looked after, what they eat and what they produce. They will also see examples of recycling on the farm.
