The course takes place at Bore Place, an eco-venue and sustainable education centre, on a working organic farm situated in the heart of the West Kent countryside. The Connected Leaders experience will support you through a reflective journey to examine your own values and how they connect to your professional position as a school leader. We recognise that outstanding leadership is about much more than management and implementation skills. For the best leaders, it is rooted in personal and emotional engagement with a moral purpose. The course is based on experiential learning, using both indoor and outdoor environments that will help you to widen the scope of your leadership at many levels. This will provide a foundation from which to actively challenge assumptions and explore new perspectives for effective and lasting school improvement.

Day 1: REFLECTION

Reflection will permeate the whole course embracing reflection and interconnection between ourselves, our values and the natural environment, and how these relate to new models of leadership for school improvement.

Day 2: CHANGE

Incremental and transformational change through nurturing relationships with all school stakeholders, whilst looking outwards to the wider world.

Day 3: FUTURESCOPING

Thinking through futures for ourselves, our schools and wider society, and adopting practical tools for planning and implementing school improvement initiatives. Course cost is £450 per person and includes accommodation at Bore Place, all meals, refreshments and materials.
